The Highway Department has been sanding roads, guardrail repair, picking up trees, and general maintenance on equipment and trucks.

Supervisor — The Town received an Invitation To Comment as a Consulting Party on a Proposed Colocation/Tower Extension from Verizon Wireless as Verizon Wireless would like to add an extension to one of the County's towers on Ingraham Hill Road. Town Attorney Pope explained that the Invitation is one of the steps that Verizon Wireless is required to take in this process, and that the Town can respond or just treat the Invitation as information. Supervisor Rounds had contacted Mike Ponticello, Director of Broome County Emergency Services, prior to receiving the Invitation, and explained that the Town would like to go forward with the extension with the hope of boosting cell service coverage in the Town. There was some discussion. Supervisor Rounds will contact Mr. Ponticello for further discussion of this matter.
