UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Highway Department – Orchard Park Water Tank – Statutory Installment Bond – Resolution – The Town is part of the American Rescue Plan Act through New York State with monies coming from the Corona Virus ARPA fund, approximately \$481,000. The cost of the new water tank is \$1.1 million, minus the \$481,000; the Water/Sewer Department has between \$200,000 to \$250,000 that the Town is going to use. Instead of financing the balance, the Town has asked Town Attorney Pope to set up a bond wherein the General Fund will loan the Town's Water Department the money for the bond. The Water Department will be charged minimal interest. There was discussion. A motion was made by Councilperson Nye to adopt a Resolution approving the issuance of a Statutory Installment Bond to evidence the debt of the Town's Water funds to the Town's General Fund for the purpose of financing the new Water Tank-Orchard Park project, and the motion was duly seconded by Councilperson Leighton. Permit Fees for Solar Projects – Update – The fees were set prior for solar project permits, but now there is a question of whether the fees should include all of the acreage leased for a solar project, or just the acreage that will be used of the leased land for a solar project. TOWN OF BINGHAMTON LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF THE YEAR 2022 CHAPTER 102 – BUILDING CONSTRUCTION OF THE TOWN OF BINGHAMTON CODE

Chapter 102 – Building Construction

In the R1 Residential One-Family District, an owner-applicant may apply for a permit for the construction of one (1) accessory building prior to the construction of the principal one family dwelling unit on the condition that the applicant agree in writing on the permit application that if the principal one family dwelling unit is not fully constructed in accordance with the provisions of this Code within eighteen (18) months of the issuance of the permit for the accessory building that the owner-applicant shall at its own cost and expense, dismantle and remove said accessory building within thirty (30) days of issuance of such a notice or order from the Building Inspector and that upon failure of the owner-applicant to do so that the Town may enter upon the owner-applicant's property and dismantle and remove said accessory building with all such costs and expenses being assessed as a lien or charge upon the subject property and in addition with the owner-applicant being subject to the penalties set forth in Section 102-20 herein.

WHEREAS, the capital project hereinafter described has been determined to be an Unlisted Action pursuant to the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation promulgated pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act, the implementation of which as proposed, the Town Board has determined will not result in a significant environmental effect; and

WHEREAS, by a Bond Resolution dated July 5, 2022, the Town Board of the Town of Binghamton, Broome County, New York, authorized the issuance of \$200,000 Local Finance Law Bonds of said Town to pay the cost of the new Water-Tank Orchard Park project for said Town, including original, equipment, machinery, apparatus, appurtenances, and incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, and determined that the period of probable usefulness thereof was to be twenty-five years; and

WHEREAS, it has now been determined that it is in the financial interest of said Town to amortize such Local Finance Law Bond to evidence the debt of the Town's Water Funds to the Town's General Fund for the purpose of financing said project, the period of probable usefulness of said specific object or purpose being twenty-five years in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Local Finance Law; and NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Binghamton, Broome County, New York, as follows:

FIRST AUTHORIZING, the Town of Binghamton, to issue a Local Finance Law Bond to evidence the debt of the Town's Water Funds to the Town's General Fund for the purpose of financing the new Water Tank-Orchard Park project;

SECOND AUTHORIZING, pursuant to Section 62.10 of the Local Finance Law to enter into financing of the new Water Tank-Orchard Park project by way of a Local Finance Law Bond as noted above;

THIRD DELEGATING to the Supervisor, Clerk and Town Attorney to take such additional and further action as is necessary to implement this resolution, and
