### **WATER / SEWER BILLING SCHEDULE FOR 2023**

These are approximate mailing dates:

November 1st (1st billing of a cycle); due in early December February 1st (2nd billing); due in early March May 1st (3rd billing); due in early June August 1st (4th billing); due in early September



IMPORTANT NOTE: If the August bill is not paid in full by October 15th, the unpaid amount is turned over to the Broome County Real Property Tax Office as unpaid and will be relevied onto next January's Town & County tax bill. ### BROOME COUNTY LANDFILL'S HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION DATES

The BC Landfill is once again accepting hazardous waste (including household and auto batteries, propane tanks, fluorescent bulbs, driveway sealers, paints, solvents, stains, cleaners, pesticides, and pool and photography chemicals) AND old electronics (such as computers, printers, stereos, TVs, copiers, fax machines, mobile phones, etc.). You can drop these at the landfill for FREE on the following days from 7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.:

Summer is the busiest season for our department. Building projects are always in full swing, and it's also the time of year when people are wanting to clean up their unwanted junk, including old vehicles. Here's some information I thought you might find helpful.

- BUILDING PERMITS Building Permits are required for most projects, including sheds, pools, decks, porches, additions, pole barns, garages, houses, political signs, cellular towers, TV towers, and now, house generators and solar related projects. Please call my office before starting any project so that I can fill you in on any rules and regulations. If you don't have time for a call, go to the Town's website at <a href="https://www.townofbinghamton.com">www.townofbinghamton.com</a> and click on "Building Codes & Permits" to get most of your questions answered. Also, feel free to contact me via email if you have any questions. You're also more than welcome to submit your building permit application via email. My email is code@townofbinghamton.com
- **JUNK VEHICLES** If you have a junk vehicle that you want to get rid of, the best and easiest way is to call *Gary's U-Pull It* at (607) 775-1900. They'll pick your vehicle up or you can drop it off at their location at 230 Colesville Road. If they pick it up, they'll deduct a towing fee from the price they'll give you. Car pricing is based upon the make, model, condition, and weight of the vehicle. A car can generally bring anywhere from \$200 to \$600. Call *Gary's U-Pull It* if you have questions.
- **MUNICIPAL CLEANUP DAYS** will be held again this year on September 22 & 23rd. Check out the front page to get all of the details. This is a great opportunity to get rid of your junk for free. I hope you all have an enjoyable summer.

### DOG SHELTER LAW PROTECTS DOGS DURING THE DOG DAYS OF SUMMER!

The Dog Shelter Law is a law that applies to all seasons, including summer. Section 353-B of the New York Agriculture and Markets Law requires dog owners to provide shelter for their dogs. The shelter must protect your dog

from direct sunlight, rain, snow, wind, cold weather, hot weather, and other inclement conditions. The shelter must be waterproof, insulated, and allow the dog to move around freely. The dog must be able to stand up, turn around, and lie down.

Violators will receive a court citation and be required to pay a fine ranging from \$50 to \$250 and will need to show proof of shelter for the dog. If you suspect that someone is not providing their dog with adequate food and/or shelter, please call the Sheriff's Dept. at (607) 778-1911 and press 1 to speak with a Deputy or call the New York State Police at (607) 775-1241.

### **HOW TO HELP A PET LEFT IN A HOT CAR**

- Take down the car's make, model, and license plate number.
- If there are businesses nearby, notify their managers or security guards and ask them to make an announcement to find the car's owner. Many people are unaware of the danger of leaving pets in hot cars and will quickly return to their vehicle once they are alerted to the situation.
- If the owner can't be found, call (607) 778-1911 and press 1 to speak with a Deputy or call the NYS Police at (607) 775-1241. Wait by the car for the authorities to arrive.
