Supervisor Rounds and The Town Bookkeeper Sandra Reifler met with each individual Department head, The Board had their annual Board meeting working on this together going through the budget line item by line item, to come to the tentative Preliminary Budget with a 0.26% decrease in the Town of Binghamton taxes for 2024. This is the fifth consecutive year for a decrease in the Town taxes.

- The Jetter has returned from Ohio it is working properly.
- There was discussion regarding a weight limit on Foland road for large trucks to be deterred from using this road as a travel route, also during the winter months the dangers of possible accidents on the hill. The study last year did not show whether the vehicle traffic is mainly cars or heavy trucks. After a lengthy discussion It was decided that the issue will resolve itself.
- Water bills have been sent out.
